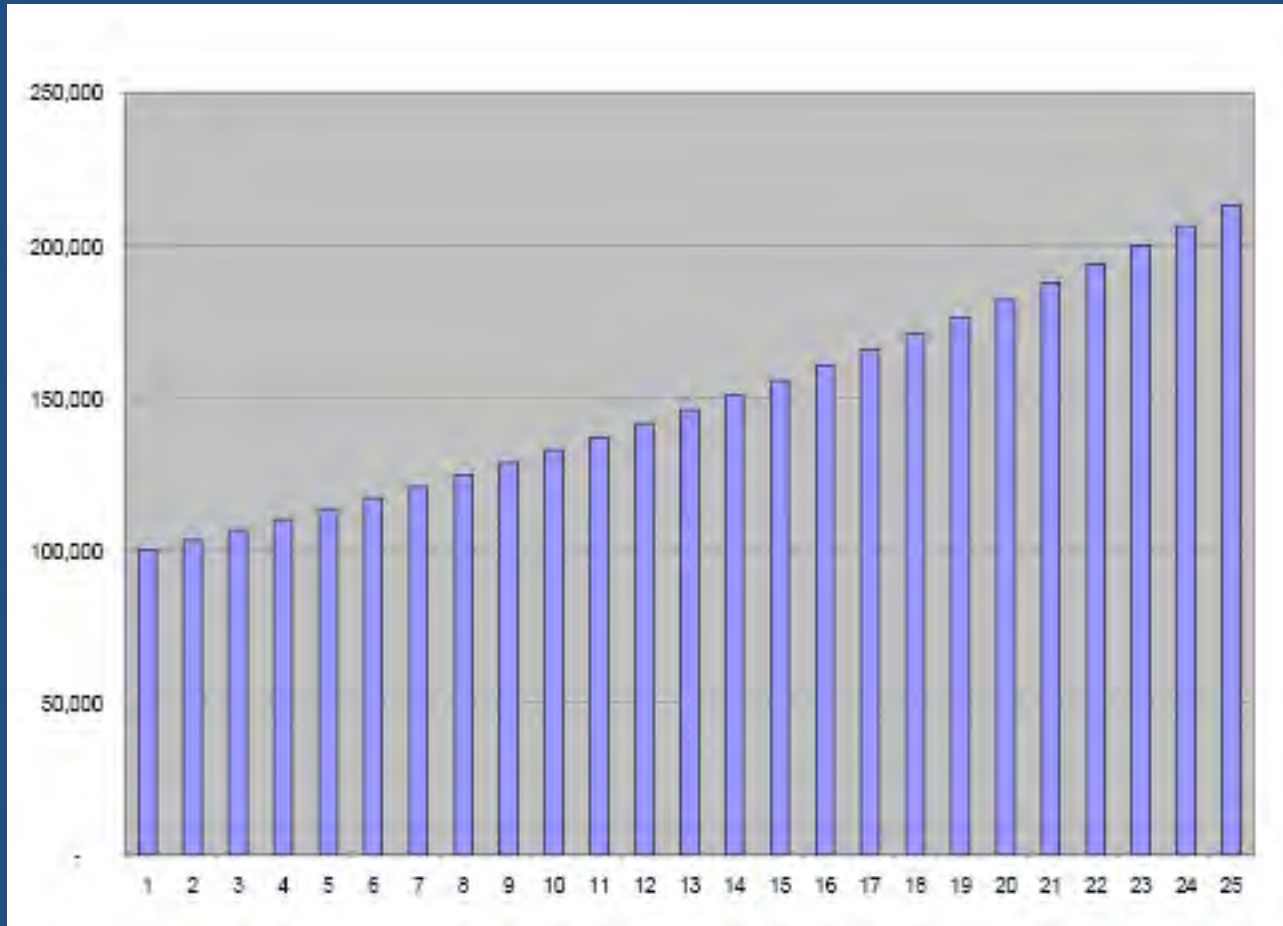

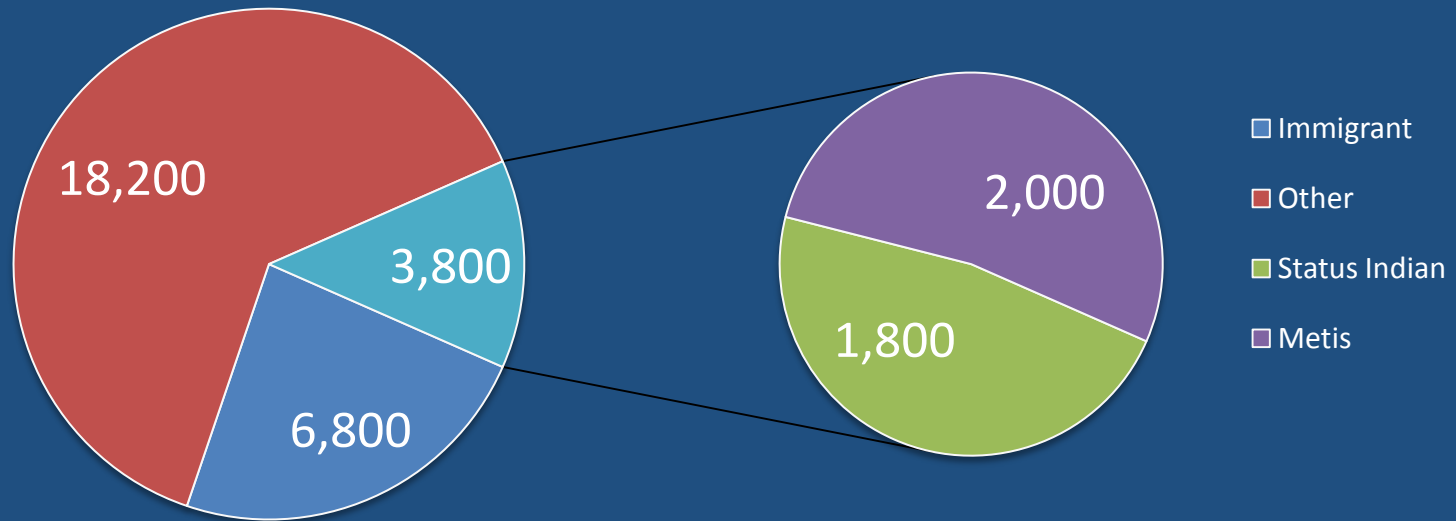
ABORIGINAL BUILDS
